Welcome Reception

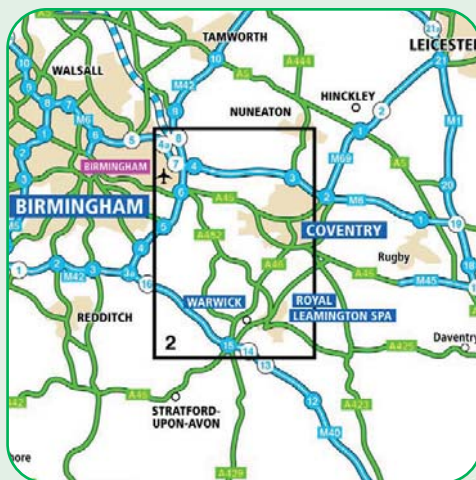
